JOBS & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

WHAT WE HEARD:

- Provide incentives to encourage new business into town
- Support existing businesses to prevent closures and loss of jobs, particularly Mingenew Supermarket Plus Liquor
- Create more job opportunities for young people

WHAT WE'RE DOING:

- \$43,000 Community Assistance Scheme Grant Program
- Continue to advocate for housing and local purchasing contracts with potential renewables/resource sector opportunities
- Continue to engage with CBH on expansion project and workers accommodation
- Complete the new Daycare facility for increased capacity valued at \$1M
- \$1,020,000 Shire of Mingenew Emergency Evacuation Centre / Rec Centre Upgrade

LOCAL ROADS

WHAT WE HEARD:

- Improve the condition of gravel roads through regular grading and maintenance
- Repair potholes and maintain sealed road surfaces
- Continue sealing gravel roads
- Ensure work is timely and done by qualified professionals

WHAT WE'RE DOING:

- Implemented a dedicated Road Improvement Program additional 5% in real terms rates per year for 3 years to generate \$300,000
- Continued increase in long term maintenance budget by over \$400,000
- Wet Grade priority roads
- Gravel re-sheet priority roads
- Every road graded once per year
- Dedicated budget for vegetation management
- Upgrade 2.4km Coalseam Rd
- Increased resealing program:
 - 1.24km Urban
 - 2.0km Rural
